# Sustainable Urban Drainage Improvements

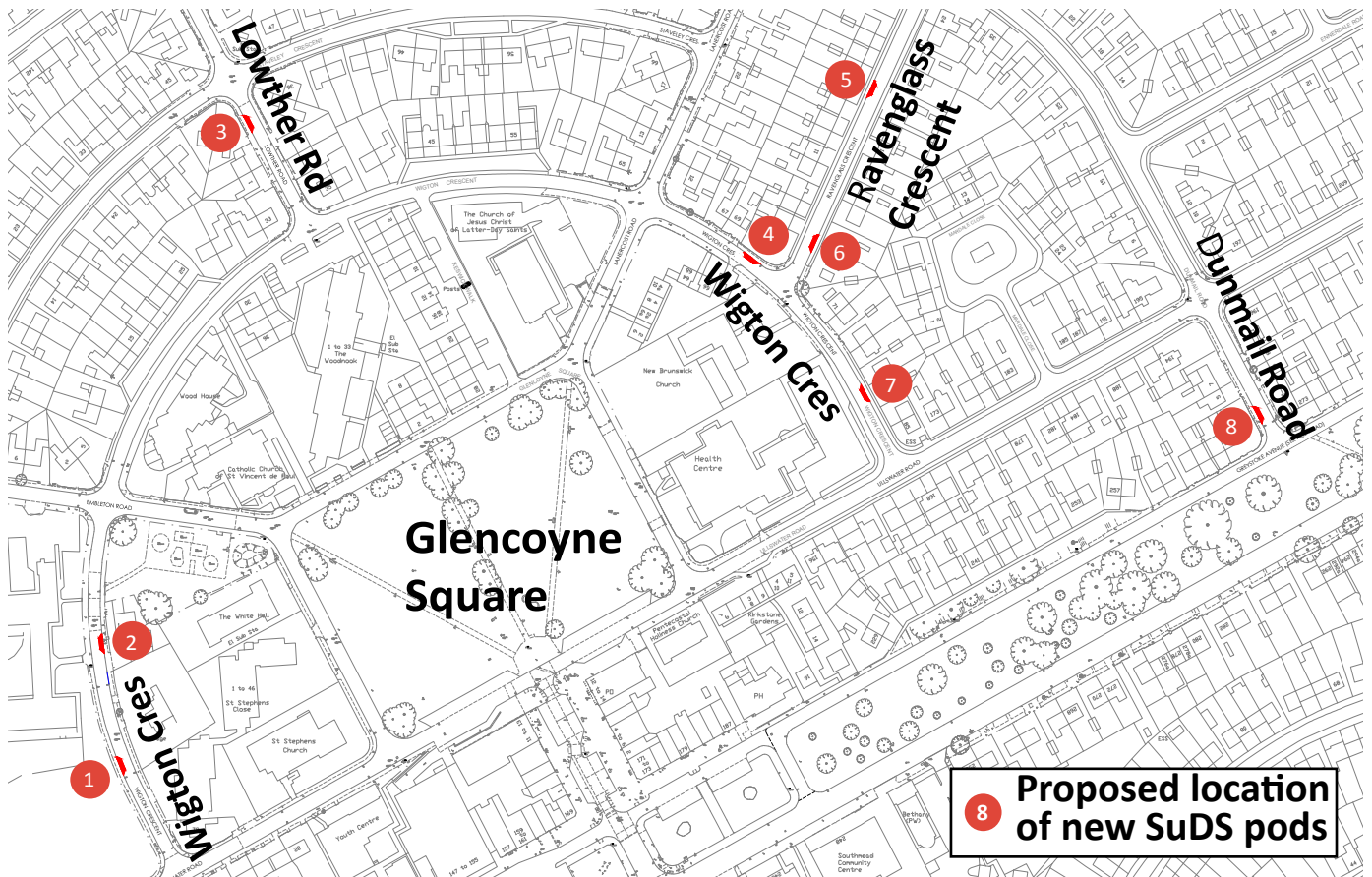
8 new Sustainable Urban Drainage (SuDs) pods will be constructed on Wigton Crescent, Lowther Rd, Dunmail Rd and Ravenglass Crescent. The SuDs pods are part of the Southmead Regeneration project.

Sustainable Urban Drainage is a way of reducing the amount of rain that goes underground into pipes and sewers. The SuDs pods are planting beds which absorb rainwater more slowly than a road surface, and help reduce flooding.

The SuDs pods will be like the existing ones on Embleton Road. They will allow more planting in your street, and help to make Southmead greener.



## Southmead Urban Sustainable Drainage (SuDS)



- Bristol City Council is working hard to reduce future flooding issues for residents. Southmead has clay soil and rain water quickly runs off to cause flooding issues downstream both locally and further into the city centre.
- The new SuDS pods will be located where they will take as much surface rainwater from the roads and pavements as possible. They are positioned near to existing road drains and gulleys. Access to driveways will not be affected by the new SuDS pods.
- The pods will be constructed over this winter. We will update you on the exact dates nearer the time.
